Vidya is no longer with us but no one can deny the fact that Vidya's photograph is firmly ENGRAVED in his heart. Vidya was a gentleman of the highest caliber and an Engineer par excellence. Even though he held the high posts of Factory Director



and Group Manufacturing Director, he was a modest, ever smiling, down to earth person who was ever willing to offer his advice and help others, especially his subordinates. Even though I knew Vidya, my relationship with him grew after I started visiting Singer Industries and Regnis Factories to discuss defects and quality of products. On every occasion I visited Regnis, he greeted me, offered a cup of tea and despite his enormous duties as Group Manufacturing Director, accompanied me to the factory to discuss the problems with his Factory Manager and Line Managers.

Vidya was solely responsible for setting up the Regnis Factory and amongst his other accomplishments was getting Regnis to be the first Factory in South Asia to introduce R600 gas to its Refrigerators. As most of you are aware, Vidya was ailing for some time with a memory problem and partial paralysis. Yet he continued to meditate as far as possible' I still remember vividly, the day the three Musketeers, late Berty, late Vidya and my good friend Nelson visited me when I was recuperating at the Asiri Surgical Hospital in May 2018 after undergoing an operation on my left fractured femur. Before leaving the hospital, Vidya placed his hand on my head and said 'Don't worry Gamini, you will recover soon. We will pray for your speedy recovery' True to his words, I was released from the hospital three days later with instructions to use the walker for two weeks whenever I need to walk. This is the quality of a perfect human being.

Farewell my dear friend Vidya. Your pleasant memories will linger in my mind until I follow you to the 'Land of no return'


