EVOLUTION OF THE CRICKET BAT

(An Article from the 'Herald Sun' Melbourne, Australia is re-produced for the benefit of the cricket loving members of the Association.)

1620s: The first mention of a Cricket Bat can be traced back to this time. The initial shape was like a Hockey Stick to help hit the ball which was exclusively delivered underarm and along the ground.

1770s: Bats start to take a rectangular profile as bowlers are allowed to loop the ball in the air, while still delivering underarm.

1820s: Laws are changed to allow bowlers to deliver round-arm. The bat takes its truly modern form.

1920s: Sir Donald Bradman uses a bat weighing 2lb 2oz. It is very slim with a straight profile and thin edges. Fellow Australian great Bill Ponsford prefers "BIG BERTHA" weighing 2lb 9 oz.

1960-70: International Super Stars like Clive Lloyd and Graeme Pollock use bats far heavier than the norm, often exceeding 3lbs. But a lightweight bat is always the weapon of choice for West Indies icon Sir Garfield Sobers.

Mid 1970s: Australian Captains Greg and Ian Chapell use the Grey-Nocolls Scoop with success. West Indies great Brian Lara uses a version of the GN Scoop to post his the world record of 375 against England in April 1994.

<u>1979</u>: Australion fast bowling legend Dennis Lillee uses an Aluminium bat, the COMBAT in a Test against England in Perth. The bat is soon banned by authorities who deem all bats must be made from wood.

<u>Early 1980s</u>: New Zealand strongman Lance Cairns uses the Newberry Excalibur, the first shoulderless bat. Cairns famously uses the bat to blast six sixes in 10 balls at the MCG in 1983.

<u>2010</u>: Australian great Matthew Hayden unveils a specific T20 bat, the MONGOOSE. This revolutionary bat has a blade 33% shorter than normal and the handle is 43% longer than a regular bat.
