



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AGM IN PICS

We walk into a plush showroom leisurely and admire the range of products showcased. Little do we wonder as to how many myriad decisions of planning and executing has gone to turn a mixture of raw materials to a gleaming product. Procurement decisions are crucial in any industry. They can make or break a market. The SINGER BRAND has always been synonymous with durability and versatility and has always been on par with the changing market environment. Meeting a person who was at the helm

of procurement for three decades at Singer was indeed fulfilling. He is Mr. Anton Abeyesekera, Purchasing Director who retired in 2006. We spent a very productive morning chatting to this genial gentleman.

Q-Mr. Abeyesekara, shall we retrace your steps back to your young days.

A-I am a proud Benedictine! Sports gained predominance over studies when I was young. Cricket was my passion and I loved it. I was elated when Mr Candappa, my first coach named me the captain of the under 12 team. I represented the school at all age groups and finally at the prestigious First Eleven.

Q- Other than sports did you have any other hobbies?

A-I was an avid reader of books and my cousin who was a great reader and collector of books gave me access at all times to his library. I also read and studied books on science which was also my passion.

Q- You have a science degree from the University of Ceylon. From Science to a business environment, how did the transition happen?

A-I believe that acquiring a degree in Science was a great asset as scientific planning and developing systems is vital in all areas of management. After graduation, I did a short stint at teaching Chemistry. Then I was drawn to the business world by the comparatively lucrative salaries. I first landed at Cargills and began my career as a member of the management staff as assistant manager Kandy branch in 1968. Then came the breakthrough! A vacancy at Singer intrigued me. Mr. Rajaratnam the general manager then interviewed us.

Q- Was Mr. Rajaratnam your first mentor?

A-When I first joined Singer, Mr Harry Jayasinghe the Marketing Manager at that time was my first guru and his training program of one month left a lasting impression in my mind. The General Manager Mr. Rajaratnam was a brilliant chartered accountant, a financial wizard and his forte of planning of work functions and style of leadership was ingrained in my mind and I was convinced that he was a visionary. After Mr. Rajaratnam two other men of stature chartered the course skillfully within a short space of time and Singer became one of the most successful organisations. Mr Lohendra Namasivayam or simply Nan as he was called expanded the network to a degree and instilled discipline. But it was the vision and ambition of Mr Hemaka Amarasuriya that paved the way for greater success.

Q- At that time we had only Singer Industries as a factory. So how was procurement done to cater to the massive requirement?

A – Mr Amarasuriya did the next best thing and gave me a mandate to select products of good quality from local and overseas factories according to predetermined guidelines which eventually gave the company market leadership positions. The import of refrigerators was our first focus and we commenced the import of a good quality range from a Sanyo factory in Thailand and our brand became an instant success. In order to sustain this product introduction we had to set up a Service centre which we did and it was also under my purview initially. I am indeed glad and grateful to have had the opportunity to play my part in operations in the relevant fields to the best of my ability to fulfil the dreams and aspirations and expedite the achievements to fruition of these great visionaries.

Q - How did you counterattack competition with strong brands like Sony?

A- Since we had strong Japanese and Korean brands of good quality in the Market we had to match them. Thus selection of the right product was very important. With smart strategies we overcame that situation. In Audio for example we became the market leader with the Singer brand with a range imported from South Korea. The entry of Singer Television to the local market was a great challenge and a success story. During one of my visits to a Chinese fair, I was impressed with a company called TCL and apprised Mr. Amarasuriya about this company on the telephone. We successfully launched a Singer branded range and eventually became market leaders in Television. With the success story of TV s, we gained confidence to venture into washing machines and kitchen appliances.

Q - The acquisition of the Sisil Brand was a formidable step. How did it enhance the product portfolio?

A -It hastened the growth of the company with a wide range of products. We also identified niche markets and introduced good quality products which eventually gave us market leadership with products such as water pumps and Generators.

Q - Any challenges faced with expansion?

A - The sudden closure of the Singer Nikko company in Japan which produced a range of industrial Sewing Machines for the Garment industry sent shock waves. Though Juki was the market leader in the world for Industrial Sewing Machines, Singer too had a significant market share in some locations. We were able to locate a manufacturer of Industrial Sewing Machines in South Korea and was able to continue selling industrial Sewing machines in our brand.

Q- What were the highlights of your career?

A - In the year 2002 the phenomenal growth achieved by Singer Sri Lanka over the years was recognized by the Board of Directors and the hierarchy of the Singer World Corporation and it was decided to set up a Sourcing Division which would look after the product requirements of worldwide locations. Mr.William Ginsberg was appointed Head of this new Division and I was appointed Director of Global Sourcing. I retired from the Singer organisation in the year 2006.

Q- If you were to publish a memoir of your life at Singer, what would be the catch phrase or sentence?

A - Well, it would be a whole paragraph!

Working for the Singer organization was indeed a challenge as intimated to me by Mr. Rajaratnam at my first interview. When Mr. Hemaka Amarasuriya retired from Singer in the

year 2010 after 25 years at the helm he sent a message to all employees through the issue of Sinera in July 2010 and also made arrangements to send me a copy although I had left Singer by that time. I reproduce an extract from that message as it is indeed complimentary, and he recognized the contribution. I quote "A very strong supply base was built up by Mr. Anton Abeyesekera the then Purchasing Director who was instrumental in selecting the best manufacturing locations from all over the world and getting them to manufacture for Singer" I close. When the Boss has confidence in your ability it is a great pleasure to perform and the challenge is less demanding. Thank you, Mr. Amarasuriya, for your support. Mr. Abeyesekara leads a happy retired life with his wife Nixita, and his two Sons Navindra and Naresh, both Finance professionals. They live in the vicinity of his residence down Thimbirigasyaya Road, Colombo. He and his wife enjoy the company of their three grandchildren. In his own words, using his talents, to give back to society and to his God by engaging in charitable ventures in helping the poor gives him immense happiness. Mr. Abeyesekera is also the author four books on Catholicism.
