RANJIT DAVID

LITTLE KNOWN FACTS ABOUT LATE MR. RANJIT DAVID

Mr. Ranjit David passed away on 4th April, 2021 and his last rites were held the following day at the Jawatta Cemetry.

The news of his death brought me immense grief as I had known him for several decades since he joined Singer in 1968 and immediately came under my wing as a District Manager. He was very intelligent and a fast learner who performed his duties as District Manager exceptionally well. When I was promoted as Marketing Services Manager, I had no hesitation in recommending him to be promoted as an Area

Manager and thus he was promoted and if I am

correct, replaced me as Area Manager - West Area (subject to correction, if I am wrong). Even though Ranjit was promoted on my recommendation, he earned the position by hard work, dedication, loyalty and honesty.

Ranjit was a sincere friend and a perfect gentleman who greeted everyone with a smile. Even though I associated with him very closely, I was unaware of his capabilities as a sportsman until I read an article in the Sunday Times of 4th April,2021 under the caption 'Versatile Sportsman Ranjit David is no more'. For the benefit of our members, I quote below a few paragraphs from this article:

Quote ": Versatile sportsman Angelo Joseph Ranjit David, passed away at the age of 78 weeks after celebrating his birthday which fell on March 10th. A former national cap in basketball, David was equally talented in cricket and football, though he was popular among all sports circuits for his immense contribution to all three sports.

"A former student of St. Michael's College, Ranjit David mastered his skills in basketball under strict upbringing and went on to captain his school in all three sports. Representing football and basketball teams of 1961 and 1962 he was adjudged the Best All round Sportsman in both years David later represented Eastern Province in all three sports and was instrumental in winning the senior national tournament in 1961, the only occasion Eastern Province won this title, Since 1963 he represented Sri Lanka in basketball alongside greats like Percy Perera and Cosmos Perera.

He joined Singer in 1968 and worked for seven years under the guidance of cricket enthusiast Hemaka Amarasuriya." Unquote

Ranjit was an active member of the Association of Past Employees of Singer and served in the Executive Committee from January 2016 to April 2021 rendering valuable service in organizing the sports events. Ranjit leaves behind his wife Louisa and his daughter Saundari and his son Rajiv. May his sole Rest in Peace'

(You may not know that in shorthand we take down the SOUND and not the SPELLING). Happy and content that I did not miss anything, I came back to my seat and 7 started typing. Midway, I got stuck as I could not get at the proper meaning of what I had written down. I didn't dare go back to Mr. de Silva.(Here I must say that Judith and I had learnt Pitman's Shorthand while Mrs.Maniam and Shiroma used Gregg's Shorthand). So I called Judith and asked her whether she could help me to read what I had taken down. She too struggled for some time and ultimately said Mr. de Silva had meant "open inverted commas" and "close inverted commas". He had meant "QUOTES" and not "COURTS" which have identical sound. I was greatly relieved as I could complete my typing to Mr. de Silva's satisfaction.

I must add that we - all of us enjoyed our Pool Life and helped each other where necessary, shared jokes and even family matters when all of us were free. I still enjoy thinking of our GOOD OLD POOL DAYS(1965-1978)

Continuing..... THE CASE OF THE WOOD WORK FINISHING BY T.V. PERERA

Short necked MeemaKariyawasam who owned cows, buffaloes and paddy lands had a dry, wrinkled skin, being exposed continuously to the sun. Department Manager Thanikasalam who came into the section one morning enquired of Charge Hand Wijetunge as to whose pair of legs were protruding from under the work bench. Wijetunge awoke Kariyawasam who had worked a rare whole night and crept to snatch forty winks. Kariyawasam habitually took excessive days off work to attend to the tilling and harvesting activities of his paddy lands during the seasons and had to pay the penalty for same. Another senior workman with piercing eyes and a loud vile mouth Seemon, although poked himself into everything wanted and not, was a perfectionist in the craft of assemblying cabinets. Along with Heen Banda, Seemon accepted the first VRS offer of Rs. 4000 in 1970 and both left to take to agriculture.

Lacquered drawers and bent covers were completed once fitted with knobs and locks by Wilfred Samarawickrema who during his schooling at LumbiniMahaVidyalaya followed oriental dancing guru Heen Baba Dharmasena's classes and acquired the walking style of Sabaragamuwa dancers, swaying his arms across his body and walking on toes even during work hours. When a man in the land across the factory committed suicide by hanging himself from a breadfruit tree, Samarawickrema who visited the scene seemingly developed an instinctive feeling plus a mental sensation which he very enthusiastically demonstrated giving a vivid narration of the incident to individuals and groups of eager listeners, gesturing and motioning continuously with his fingers the round shape of breadfruit, which immediately earned him the nickname Del.

Following the country's economic revival in the mid 1970s the Finishing Section was allocated additional job operations when orders of cabinets to Male and Chittagong were executed. The export items were polished mirror-like using buffing compound, and one could see his image in them. MailaRanasinghe known thus due to his bear-like hairy body and one time trade apprentice Lucian Murcott were assigned to perform the compounding jobs. The latter resigned subsequently to take up an executive appointment at the Pfaff Sewing Machine Company Ranjith Dharmakeerthi alias Attidiye Raja claimed to be an exponent of CheenaAdi. A notorious character, he had been involved in several gang fights and brawls in and around Attidiya and spent time in police cells. During the 1972 excursion, we billed for the night at the Polonnaruwa Pilgrims Rest and Dharmakeerthiproferred to demonstrate to me his art of defence and attack.

Hardly had he begun on the deserted side road when I alerted him of two police patrolmen in the distance. Subsequently, both of us calmly sat on the parapet wall that ran along the boundary of the Rest. It was a period when although the JVP insurgency was over, the police took into custody any suspicious character especially loitering youth. Dharmakeerthi bravely said that he will deal with the policemen and that we should not at any cost get off the wall. No sooner the policemen stopped in front of us, Attidiye Raja in a flash slid off the wall. The policemen authoritatively questioned us as to what the hell we were doing on the wall intimating that we could be taken into custody.


The polished and assembled cabinets were ultimately packed in wooden crates which gave way for the more economical cardboard cartons, by the slight stammering Shirley Wijeratne whose heavy eyelids giving him a sleepy look, was nicknamed Nidimathaya. Of the three Tamils in the section, Balasubramaniam worked his way to Germany, while Subramaniam and Selvaraja went home to Manipay and Chavakachcheri respectively, at the outbreak of the LTTE campaign.

Indeed the Wood Work Finishing Section continued to be an integral cog in the wheel of the factory's economy that was a demonstration of the resilience that the Singer Industries' engine of growth was renowned for. What it finally needed centred on the strength, stability and fair play of the engine's driver.
